Ash Wednesday:

1) Fasting

- for every Catholic aged 18 to 59 inclusive.
- One full meal permitted on that day. In addition, two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal.
- Pregnant women and sick persons are dispensed, but should offer another sort of sacrifice instead.

2) Abstinence from meat: from age 14.

Please note that Valentine's Day, falling this year on Ash Wednesday, does **not** dispense from these rules. On Ash Wednesday, attending Holy Mass and receiving the blessed ashes is not compulsory, but strongly recommended.

Altar Servers' Training Weekend 2-4 March: Any men from 15 to 75 are welcome as day participants. Single Catholic young men 18-30 are welcome full board, staying at St Mary's Priory. New Repository! At long last, we now have a proper space for Mass cards, good books, rosary beads etc. Volunteers wanted to man it after Mass. Thank you.

Holy Communion Reminder:

To receive Holy Communion, one must be 1) a Roman Catholic 2) in state of grace (no grave sin unabsolved on one's conscience) and 3) have fasted for at least one hour.

In the traditional Latin rite used at St Mary's, Holy Communion is received kneeling (if one can), and in any case on the tongue: thank you very much in advance. Please hold Communion plate **against your throat** if no server is available.

Please **use the entire width of the Communion rail**, from one wall of the church all the way to the opposite wall, avoiding any gaps. This will make distribution quicker. Thank you.

Watch Holy Mass at St Mary's daily on www.livemass.org. The Mass of the day can be watched for 24hrs and that of the Sunday for the entire week.
